After some hard work this week, next week will continue with picking and fingerpicking but with a couple of songs thrown in for good measure.

1. Carrying on with Jamie Allan we will be revisiting part B – up the dusty end. Remember the tip of perhaps putting a sticker or something on the side of your fretboard at the 10<sup>th</sup> fret to help you spot it quickly.

Enclosed is the large print Part B and, following a query from Margaret, I have attached some information about Pick-Ups. Some of you will have seen this before.

Then we will try to play the whole tune play the whole tune, albeit slowly. Perhaps it would be a bit less confusing to try 'Herd on the Hill' this week so I will leave until next week.

#### 2. Finger Picking

Remember that our eventual aim is to play Bridge over Troubled Water fingerpicking style. However, for most of us this is a journey rather than just a new song. For those who have got finger picking under their belt then this is a chance to do some polishing.

This week we started with some Travis Picking exercises (enclosed) which we will revisit.

Then we will move on to '500 Miles' followed by our first attempt at 'Bridge Over Troubled Water'. You will notice I have changed 'Bridge..' a bit to add in Pinch chords where there is a very fast chord change. This not only makes it a bit easier to place but also adds a bit of variety.

  - Fields of Gold which we will be revisiting next week (Page 67)


# **E String A String**

### **Pick Ups**

The reason Part B starts with 2 0 rather than 3 10 is that music theory again.. it really does seem to be there to create havoc. This time it is Pick-up notes or in posh terms Anacrusis.

Think of the tune being made up of phrases with each phrase having an introduction or pick-up. If you play the pick-up without a lot of emphasis it tends to give more emphasis to the note following it. I have highlighted the pick-ups in yellow.. so Part B really starts as the last two notes of part A in bar 9. Hence - Part B starts 2 0.




### **Travis Picking exercises**
