



Open Tuning

What is Open Tuning

Ukuleles are tuned to GCEA. We then put our figures on the fret board to make chords. However, we can tune the strings of the uke so that they play a chord with no fingers and then just bar the fretboard with one finger. (Good for practicing bars)

Open E

Retune your uke -

G up a semi-tone to - G#
C down a tone to - B
E remains the same - E
A down a semi-tone - G#

If you play this open you are playing - E
Put your finger across the 5th fret you are playing - A
Put your finger across the 7th fret you are playing - B

Open G

Retune your uke -

G remains the same
C up a tone to
E remains the same


This is the tuning that Keith Richards used for most of his career with the Rolling Stones.
