

Session 30th November

The agenda for Monday will be:

- 1. 'Herd on the Hill' trying to get speed up a little and adding in chords. Nothing new with material but copied below for ease of access. The yellow highlights are the pick-ups see under 'Galway Girl'
- 2. 'Fields of Gold' Norman will be taking us through this song, trying out both tab and agreeing an arrangement e.g. which verses should be sung softer / louder do we want to add whistle into ay parts. A revised score is attached which should have bar lines in the right place.
- 3. 'The Galway Girl' (Songbook 1) we will sing through this and start to play Part A and B of the instrumental. Attached is a version of the instrumental with comments. There has been a bit of confusion with this tune and Herd on the Hill due to Pick-up notes or in posh term Anacrusis.


A pick-up note is one or more notes which are an introduction to a bar or phrase of music and tend to be at the beginning of a tune in particular. If you play the pick-up without a lot of emphasis it tends to give more emphasis to the note following it.



The last two notes are the pick-up for the next line so line 1 really finishes on the third note of the last bar.

4. Introduction to Christmas Sound Event – this is a bit of a wild shot. Rather than just writing a song we will have a go at a group sound event where lyrics are written then sounds which may be bits of tunes, drones or other sounds which can be reproduced acoustically e.g. percussion, glass bottles, vocal sounds, bells etc. More about it below.


